### God's Word to Abide in MAD0's New School

Praise God for the blessings, including you, that have continued to provide for this ministry. The construction of the school at La Maison des Agneaux de Dieu Orphanat (MADO-The House of the Lambs of God Orphanage), is one of the most recent manifestations of those blessings.

Construction on the school building has progressed wonderfully. A security wall has been constructed on three sides of the property with the fourth side being paused until government officials firmly decide where a road is to be. Until then, a temporary boundary around the school is established. Completed so far are six of the eventual ten rooms, these are receiving some finishing touches. Finishing the rooms in stages allows for earlier use of the facility. The focus now is on providing the septic tank, plumbing and school furniture. Please keep track of the progress through the bi-

monthly updates, Facebook, and/or the NEHLM.org website.

The pursuit of Christian education is a wonderful component of this ministry. In John 8:31, Christ our Lord assures us that "...If you abide in My Word, you are truly My disciples". This ministry is focused on the continual pursuit of education that not only includes God's Word, but is surrounded and directed by the Word of God. This provides the means by which the Holy Spirit will ignite and strengthen the faith of many. As we witness the orphans and students "abiding" in the Word of God, they are beacons to others in their community.

# Lamb of God Team Gives Personal Touch

Lamb of God Lutheran Church sent a team of 12 to MADO in June. It was such a blessing to witness God's great plan unfolding as He used each individual on the team to reflect His love for others. Five High School Seniors: Rachel Foye, Olivia Hassebrock, Abby Jamieson, Katie Kelleher, and Andrew Riker worked under the leadership of Stacey Hassebrock to provide five days of Vacation Bible School. Over 250 children attended on the last day. Favorite songs and bible verses were taught and the children were given opportunity to color pictures of Jesus. Food was provided daily and on the last day they were given cross necklaces to remind them that Jesus saved each one of us. All received toothbrushes and toothpaste donated by Dr. Brian Jamieson. The older orphans were given a salary for their help which encourages them to become leaders and work for an income.

Dr. Jamieson examined all the orphans and found they had been brushing their teeth well. Sandia, an older orphan that would like to be a doctor or dentist someday, was his assistant. Dr. Jamieson met with the local Haitian dentist and gave him the remaining supplies. Emily Yancey and Pastor Daniel Paul made arrangements with this dentist to repair the teeth of the few orphans that needed further care. This has already been done.

Nursing students, Madison Gatterman and Sarah Jamieson, taught health classes in the mornings, provided dressing changes, gave out medication to the orphan boys to treat a fungal infection on their scalps, all under the supervision of an RN. They worked with children that had Chikungunya Fever and were quick to diagnose symptoms. Unfortunately, many of the team members also came down with the sickness and the nursing students helped administer team medications as needed.

Ernie Frederickson planted trees at the new school, assisted with delivering food for the hungry children at VBS, and provided prayer and Bible study with Pastor Daniel. He taught children about the business world and computers based on his experience as a business owner.



Cheryl Jamieson, an RN, worked as team leader and kept the team organized and safe. She helped supervise the nursing students as well as ensuring all the orphans received dental exams.

The team was thanked for coming down to Haiti at a time when the Chikungunya fever was ever present. We all learned that God is in control and He had a plan and we are fortunate for the many luxuries we have in the US. We took away so much more from the people of Haiti than what we gave. We realized that people love God and family no matter where they live.




